The 2023 Skate By The Sea Compete USA Championships will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current members of either Learn to Skate USA and/or those who are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be a current registered member of Learn to Skate USA or a full member of U.S. Figure Skating. There will be no more than six competitors maximum in an event, and all six will receive an award.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA INTERCLUB SERIES INFORMATION: Skate By The Sea is part of the Southern California Invitational Series. All Skaters in Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Adult Pre-Bronze or Bronze Free Skate events earn points which could earn them an invitation to the Series Final in September. Entry Restrictions for 2023 due to limited ice time:

- Entries will be monitored and close when we run out of ice time
- Additional entries may be accepted if additional ice time is available

2022-23 Compete USA Competition Manual



ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries.

All Snowplow Sam and Basic 1-6 skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher, and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed, including moves in the field or individual dances.

For the Pre-Free Skate, Free Skate 1-6, levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest badge level or free skate test level passed.

Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher but not both levels in the same event during the same competition.

It is very important to the success of the competition that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If, for whatever reason, the local organizing committee (LOC) discovers that a skater has been placed in a category below his/her badge or test level, the chair and referee will have the option to move the skater into the proper level, even if it is the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fair as possible to the competitors. It is an ethical violation for coaches to sandbag an event.

Groups General:

- Skaters entering Excel Beginner, Excel High Beginner & No Test events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group.
- If there are not enough entries to hold an event, boys and girls <u>will</u> compete against each other in all levels offered at this competition.
- Showcase disciplines (Light/Dramatic) may be combined

All entries must be submitted online via **EMS**.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES:

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into three categories, Coach/Choreographer, Learn to Skate USA Instructor, or Foreign Coach/Choreographer. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found HERE. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

MUSIC:

Online music submission via EMS is the **ONLY** acceptable method to submit program music.

Deadline for uploading music is Friday, August 18, 2023 11:59pm PDT (August 19, 2023 2:59am EDT)- \$15 late fee.

Competitors must also bring a copy of their competition music on a phone (skater/coach must provide appropriate adaptor) as a backup in case of technical difficulties and said phone must be available rink side during the competition.

REFUND POLICY: Entry fees will not be refunded after **August 4, 2023** unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. E-checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a **\$25.00 fee**. Payment of this fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in the competition.



LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, Learn to Skate USA, La Jolla Figure Skating Club, and UTC Ice accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

<u>ONSITE REGISTRATION:</u> The registration table will be open on Saturday, August 26 from one hour before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration table will be located outside the building near the Bark Park.

AWARDS: Awards will be given to skaters finishing in 1st-6th place in all events.

PRACTICE ICE: No official practice ice will be offered through the club. If time allows after the schedule is set, the rink, UTC Ice, may set up a limited number of practice ice sessions. Otherwise, UTC Ice has regularly scheduled freestyle sessions on Saturday mornings. Please check their website (www.utcice.com) for times and payment.

<u>PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY</u>: Photography and Video, if vendors are available, will be available for purchase. TBD if sales will be on site or online - ONLY.

Note, <u>per U.S. Figure Skating policy</u>, photographing and/or recording of anyone other than your own skater is strictly prohibited.

<u>FACILITIES:</u> The UTC Ice Sports Center is indoors, located in a mall with an overlooking food pavilion. The ice surface measures 185' x 85' with slightly rounded corners. The rink is conveniently located within the Dining Terrace of the University Towne Center Mall.

<u>LOCKER ROOMS:</u> Locker rooms and changing areas will not be available at this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive at the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc.). Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on but changing will not be permitted in these spaces.

U.S. FIGURE SKATING TRAVEL POLICY:

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Full details of the SkateSafe Travel Policy and any exceptions can be found starting on page 12 of the SkateSafe Handbook.

PARKING:

Westfield UTC charges for parking. Parking tickets can be validated at the UTC Ice Sports rink for up to 4 free hours of parking. After the 4 hours the cost is \$2/hour. Please bring your parking ticket with you to the Registration Desk.



U.S. Figure Skating Non-qualifying Competition

Event: Snowplow Sam – Basic 6 Program with Music

General event parameters:

- The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc., unless otherwise specified.
- To be skated on full ice with music
- The skater may use elements from a previous level
- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level.
- Bonus skills from the same level or below are allowed but will not be judged elements
- Snowplow Sam will be divided by level 1-4 if registration warrants.

U.S. Figure Skating Non-qualifying Competition

Event: Pre-Free Skate – Free Skate 1-6 Program with Music

General event parameters:

- The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times an element is executed, length of glides, number of revolutions, etc., unless otherwise stated. Connecting steps and transitions should be demonstrated throughout the program.
- To be skated on full ice
- The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use but is not required to use any additional elements from previous levels
- · Bonus skills from the same level or below are allowed but will not be judged elements
- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level

2022-23 Pre-Free Skate – Free Skate 1-6 Requirements



EVENT: Well Balanced Program Free Skate - Singles

General event parameters: Skaters may <u>not</u> enter both a Well Balanced Free Skate event and an Excel Program event at the same non-qualifying competition.

- 1. Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted at all levels.
- 2. Level will be determined by the highest free skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or skate up to one level higher.
 - A. Preliminary Free Skate Program Rule 6470
 - B. Pre-Preliminary Free Skate Program Rule 6480
 - C. No Test (a.k.a. Surfer) Free Skate Program Rule 6490

2023-24 Well Balanced Free Skate Requirements

EVENT: 2022-2023 Excel Free Skate

General event parameters:

- 1. Skaters may <u>not</u> enter both a Well-Balanced Free Skate event and an Excel Free Skate event at the same non-qualifying competition.
- 2. Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted at all levels.
- 3. Level will be determined by the highest Free Skate test passed at the close of entries. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or "skate up" to one level higher.

For events run as 6.0, the following deductions will be taken:

- 0.1 from each mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra element included.
- 0.1 from the technical mark for any spin that is less than the required minimum revolutions
- A. Excel High Beginner (a.k.a. Star Fish)
- B. Excel Beginner (a.k.a. Sand Castles)
- C. Excel Pre-Preliminary
- D. Excel Preliminary
- E. Excel Preliminary Plus

U.S. Figure Skating Non-qualifying Competition

EVENT: Showcase Events –

Light Entertainment Events

Format:

• Showcase program that should express a carefree concept or storyline designed to uplift and entertain the audience through related skating movements, gestures and physical actions.

Dramatic Entertainment Events

Format:

 Programs should express intense emotional connection and investment in the music, choreography and theme concept through related skating movements, gestures and physical actions.

Duet Events –

General event parameters:

- 1. Level will be determined by the highest free skate <u>or</u> dance (solo or partnered) test passed. Skaters must enter the same level as their free skate event. If a free skate event is not being entered, skaters must enter at their current test level or one level higher.
- 2. Current guidelines and procedures for non-qualifying showcase competitions can be found at www.usfigureskating.org.
- 3. Showcase disciplines (Light & Dramatic) maybe combined at the discretion of the referee.
- 4. Depending on the number of entries, boys and girls may compete against each other in Showcase events.

Costumes: Costuming and make-up for showcase skating programs should enhance the feeling created by the performance and reflect the meaning of the story, theme, or character portrayed on the ice. The clothing of the competitors must be dignified and appropriate for artistic competition. The clothing may be theatrical in design and reflect the chosen music. Costume rules for Singles/Pairs/Dance/Synchro/TOI programs do not apply for showcase skating. Wearable Inflatable costumes are not permitted in any solo, duet/trio, interpretive event. In the event a skater performs with a wearable inflatable costume in aforementioned event, the skater may be disqualified

Judging: Performances will be judged from an entertainment standpoint for theatrical qualities. Technical skating skills and difficulty will not be rewarded as such; however, skating must be the major element of the performance and be of sufficient quality to support the selected theatrical elements. Unintended falls, poorly executed skating elements and obvious loss of control will reduce contestant's marks. Jump difficulty is not rewarded in showcase; therefore jumps, if choreographed, should be performed with style, flow and confidence. Theatrical elements evaluated will include energy, poise, acting, pantomime, eye contact, choreography, form/extension and the use of props and ice. The 6.0 judging system will be used. Deductions will be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.
